Show Summary

The History

Matilda is a book by British writer Roald Dahl. It was published in 1988 by Jonathan Cape in London, with 232 pages and illustrations by Quentin Blake. In 2012, the book was ranked #30 among all-time children's novels in a survey published by *School Library Journal*. It was the first of four books by Dahl among the Top 100, more than any other writer. *Time* included *Matilda* in its list of the 100 Best Young-Adult Books of All Time. Worldwide sales have reached 17 million, and since 2016 sales have spiked to the extent that it outsells Dahl's other works.

Matilda was adapted as an audio reading by actress Kate Winslet, a 1996 feature film directed by Danny DeVito, a two-part BBC Radio 4 program, and a 2010 musical adapted by Dennis Kelly, with music and lyrics by Tim Minchin and directed for the stage by Matthew Warchus. After the roaring success of the full-length production of Matilda, opening in London in 2011 and on Broadway in 2013, there was a great demand for a simplified version of the show specifically for kids. Matilda JR. was born and features many of the beloved music and characters from the original version. This simplified version allows children not only to perform as the students but take a turn in the adult roles as well.

The Story

Matilda JR. is the story of an extraordinary little girl with extraordinary powers. The daughter of abusive parents, Matilda finds refuge in library books, which she reads quickly and in creating her own stories. Things are no better at school, where Matilda also must face a tyrannical and cruel headmistress, Miss Trunchbull, who believes in Crunchem Hall's motto: "Bambinatum est Magitum," or "Children are Maggots." She finds companionship in her teacher, Miss Honey, who, though well-intentioned, is shy and fragile. Brave little Matilda knows she has to stand up against the adults in her world, and in doing so, discovers her own remarkable powers. Matilda's bravery teaches Miss Honey and her classmates an important lesson -- that even though life can be hard, "nobody but me is gonna change my story" so "sometimes you have to be a little bit naughty."

STAGE CREW INFORMATION

What is Stage Crew?

Stage crew students are a vital part of a production's success. Even though they aren't seen throughout the show, they work behind the scenes to make sure all the technical elements are running smoothly. Being a member of stage crew is a demanding job, because one wrong move could affect the show more noticeably than a forgotten line or missed entrance. Every cue needs to happen on time and in exactly the right way for things to run safely and smoothly.

What jobs or roles are available?

There are a few different types of jobs the stage crew members can fulfill. These include:

- Stage Hands they work onstage moving set pieces during scene changes
- Rail Operators they fly vertical scenery in and out using the ropes backstage
- Spotlight Operators the run the follow spots to highlight specific actors onstage
- Light Board Assistant helps coordinate the light board cues and changes
- Sound Assistant helps run the accompaniment tracks at the sound board

How does my child get assigned a job?

Weekly workshops will be held for all stage crew members to learn the basics of every job and familiarize them with each aspect of technical theatre. They will thoroughly understand and demonstrate good safety practices, as well as get hands-on learning opportunities with guidance from experienced teachers.

A few weeks before the show, we will assign specific jobs and tasks to each crew member based on their skillset and familiarity with them. Those students who demonstrate more responsibility and reliability during the workshop process will likely be given more important tasks during the show. Just like the cast, though, there is a role for everyone, and it is our job to make sure we find the best fit for each crew member as it relates to the needs of the production.
